**Theresa Eggleston, 321 Jefferson**, read a statement that she had written. Would like to have Ordinances reviewed, especially RV parking.

**Gary Brown 312 W. 7<sup>th</sup>**, regarding RV parking.

**Misty Clark 413 W. 3<sup>rd</sup>**, regarding RV parking.

**Edward Young, 507 N. Jefferson**, issue with the use of police department delivering notices. Asked that the ordinances be reviewed.

**Lacy Mill 405 N. Fern Circle**, police dept delivering mail.

**Roger Gutzmer 417 Madison**, police force.

**Larry Cowan 114 Jackson**, apologized to citizens, explained the reason for using the police for delivery. Explained his use of RV for sleeping. Review Ordinances.

**Denise Mason 211 N Washington**, police delivery.

**Judy Gutzmer 417 Madison**, needs to have some gray area, not black and white. Notice for trash receptacle.

**Walter Hoyt, 711 N. Washington**, review Ordinances.

**Crystal Garret 515 Ashton**, review and revise Ordinances. Asked for a condensed copy of Ordinances available for citizens.

**Katy Brown 300 W. 6<sup>th</sup>**, trash can letters.

**Cody Brown 300 W. 6<sup>th</sup>**, questioned about trash cans. Asked if the whole city will be involved in determining how things are going to be addressed. Rodney Eggleston, 321 Jefferson, caution to Council how things are being handled.

**Cynthia Hoyt 717 N. Washington**, regarding travel trailer, picking and choosing who received letters. Address every Ordinance on the book, all or none.

**Martin Hansen, 112 N. Jackson**, regarding inoperable vehicle. Council needs to review and push back the 13<sup>th</sup> deadline date.

**Justin Mills, 405 Fern**, trash can letter.

**Teresa Eggleston, 321 N. Jefferson**, asked about ancient Ordinances.

**Ray Huff, Police Chief**, does not think Ordinances are necessarily bad, takes blame for working in the gray area and not enforced to the letter, used some discretion. He also explained the definition of inoperable vehicles.

**Greta Hagen, 200 S. Commercial**, suggested that Council review the ordinances that have been a current issue.

**Eric Shaffer, 616 N Jefferson**, abandoned cars.

**Jennifer Bennet, 401 E 7<sup>th</sup>**, asked Council to review the 3 dogs, 3 cats per household, treat at on case by case basis.

**Jeneva Davis, 612 N. Jefferson**, asked about leash law on cats.

**Angie Croxton, 200 N. Commercial**, Asked to change the time and date of citywide cleanup.
